#### How to find us

The Seed Box is situated behind the site of the old Flitwick Leisure Centre on Steppingley Road, MK45 1TH.

For security reasons there's currently a temporary fence around the old leisure centre in Flitwick. The entrance gate has been fitted with a padlock that works with an allotment key. Please be sure to close and lock the gate behind you every time you use it.

When The Seed Box is open for trading a committee member will remove the padlock and then secure the site on leaving. We ask everyone to be vigilant to ensure no unauthorised persons enter the site.

The fence is a temporary measure until Central Bedfordshire Council decide on a more permanent means of fully securing the site until it is sold.

In the meantime we will endeavour to keep you updated on the situation as soon as we hear of any proposals.

# **David Empson 1938 - 2018**

David was a big man; when he entered a room you took notice, when he spoke you listened and Flitwick Gardeners Association owe him so much. A founder member of the FGA his favourite story was of how on the first day of trading, from what were a set of stables (long gone) on the High Street, that if the Association had not got it they would get it. A customer asked for a greenhouse. The following week that customer had his greenhouse!! That was 1974 and right through to February this year David was an active member of the FGA holding several positions, including several years as Chairman. He was also the representative for Beds, Bucks & Herts to the Eastern Region of the National Executive of Allotment Societies; speaking up for allotments when many, including Flitwick were threatened with unwanted relocation or worse. He knew allotment law.

When David stepped down from the Executive he was awarded Life Membership of the Association, but he didn't rest on his laurels; he remained a member of the Show Committee. In that capacity apart from assisting at the Shows with setting up, breaking down afterwards, selling raffle tickets etc. he was always ready to give advice on how to display exhibits to their best, for which many entrants over the years can be grateful. He turned many entries into prize winners and this is where I personally am very grateful to David. He also ran the FGA Quiz, finding all the questions, where his aim was for people to enjoy themselves and fairly easily get the majority of right answers. David was an RHS Judge who encouraged me to learn from him what to look for as a Show Judge. We went to several Shows where initially I watched, but gradually was asked more and more to make the decisions until finally I was added to the RHS list of judges with David's recommendation. As I said at the beginning, David Empson was a big man and he will be missed.

# **FGA TO CLOSE?**

As a result of the AGM we currently have no one in the FGA Officer posts of Treasurer and Trading Secretary and without someone in each of these positions we cannot continue to operate as an Association. Unless both of these roles are filled within the next two months the Executive Committee will need to consider how to close down the Association.

Below is an outline of each of the roles:

#### <u>Treasurer</u>

- All FGA banking matters including payments of invoices and paying income from the Seed box into the bank.
- Provide monthly tracking report to the Executive Committee
- Arrangement and payment of FGA insurance.
- Balancing of income / expenses from the Seed box / shows
- Production of Annual Accounts and getting them 'examined'
- Till guardian including obtaining till consumables
- PDQ machine operation including obtaining consumables.
- Managing the FGA bank account as required

#### **Trading Secretary**

- Co-ordinate with Seed box area controllers to ensure correct stock items held and stock levels maintained
- Put together requirements for the bulk order, place order and arrange delivery
- Put together seasonal orders, order and arrange delivery (Spring/Autumn bulbs, Onions and Potatoes)
- Co-ordinate 'Monday Mob'
- Monitor legislation changes for potential impact on stock holding
- Co-ordinate Annual stock count
- Provide stock report to the Treasurer for inclusion in the Annual accounts
- Analysis of Seed box sales by area?
- Ensure that the Seed Box is maintained/cleaned/etc. as required.

#### **TRADING REPORT April 2018**

Well another AGM has come and gone and there is still no replacement Trading Secretary so here I go again producing another update for the magazine. The year has started reasonably well considering that the weather has encouraged anything but being outside gardening. When the ground was not frozen it was covered in funny white stuff or too wet to get on, except for that all important digging. Of course when the weather did change it soon became too hot and dry, but that is the lot of the gardener.

Once again I apologise to those who purchased Winston potatoes from us, I cannot remember ever having such a problem before and will be staying with the supplier next year. In fact the order for both potatoes and onions was fairly accurate and there was relatively little wastage. I will again be fine tuning the order this year and it will be more important than ever to pre-order yours so that I can meet your needs. This year there were several varieties, especially Maris Piper, which were almost completely ordered with minimal amounts for general sale. I was also able to provide a free trial potato 'Carolus' for all who pre-ordered, if you have some and have any comment please let me know.

Many of you may have noticed that we have been struggling with 'little visitors' since the start of construction of the new Leisure Centre, I've noticed it in the amount of seed being consumed by them and the amount of nesting deep in the bowels of the compost. Hopefully we finally have a complete deterrent in place; I've certainly not seen any new signs of activity recently. As a result of our visitors, we are not pushing own pack seed at present as we are not sure how much of it has been eaten. I am about to start leaving seed around to see if it gets eaten and if not will hopefully soon be back selling own pack seed. In the meantime please do ask, as what we have is in good metal cabinets so should be safe.

Late last year we set up a discount table to get rid of old stock. I do hope you managed to take advantage of that table, and the long term discount rack. I think we have tidied a lot of things up and my thanks to Jan for managing that for us. However we have now run out of obvious candidates from foods and killers for discounting so the table should disappear, but watch for it to re-appear as we start rationalising other areas.

On my plot this winter I tried a couple of green manures! I will say I am most impressed with Phacelia but not so impressed with winter grazing Rye, I think this large seed attracted the pigeons who consumed most of it before it even germinated. I'll let you know if I notice better results where the phacelia was. I do hope to be able to stock this as an over wintering green manure, especially good for

those of us on very light soil as it stops the leaching effect over winter. If you are interested in buying some please let me know as the bigger the amount I order the cheaper it becomes.

I have also got a bit carried away growing things from seeds and plugs. Do watch the FGA Facebook page as I will be saying when I'm bringing things to the Seed Box for sale, I'll take a small amount to cover my costs and the rest will go in the Keech box. If you have excess of anything please bring it along and help the FGA support this great cause.

Did you know that every year there is a 'potato race' in Greenfield/Flitton? As part of it the FGA sponsor a junior competition to grow the greatest weight of potatoes in a bucket provided by the organisers from tubers provided by us! This year we will be there weighing the potatoes and awarding gold, silver and bronze medals to the top three, hopefully there will be fewer entries to weigh that the 200+ buckets and potatoes provided to children. The potato race day is 17<sup>th</sup> June so do watch for the posters, there is normally one at the one 0 one roundabout on the fencing, then come along and join the fun.

Whilst talking of fun, there are a lot of gardens opening for charity around us. If you're interested in visiting any, we have promotional leaflets with details at the Seed Box.

Perhaps a bit off trading but worth including here is the fact that FGA is affiliated to both the Royal Horticultural Society and the National Vegetable Society. Both the monthly RHS and quarterly NVS journals are available for you to view in the Seed Box Committee room, but please do not remove them as they are there for all. The RHS magazine always has articles on many diverse aspects of gardening including reports on the results of the trials carried out by the Society. Obviously the NVS journal has a narrower focus with some excellent suggestions for soil improvement, growing show veg, pests and fungal diseases to note just some of the articles in the latest version. Well it's time to get the hanging baskets made, fill the allotment with everything that's overcrowding the greenhouse and plant on everything else. It's all go when I'm this far behind.

Finally a question, why do weeds never seem to stop growing?

#### **MYHarvest**



Calling all gardeners – we request your help!

The MYHarvest project, which started last year, is continuing for the next few years. Anyone who sent in details of their harvest last year is thanked and warmly encouraged to continue submitting results. Newcomers are very welcome to get involved.

MYHarvest (Measure Your Harvest) is a project in which gardeners can be involved, to help estimate the contribution of home-grown fruit and vegetables to UK national food production. Finding out how much food is grown at home is key to providing evidence to support the use of land for growing in urban areas, and promoting benefits to food security, healthy diets and wellbeing. Jill Edmonson and Roscoe Blevins (from Houghton Conquest), researchers at the University of Sheffield, working with the RHS and the National Allotment Society, are asking gardeners and allotment holders to provide information on the space given to edibles, and their yields. This will help them understand how much allotment and garden space is needed to ensure access to suitable land and food growing for UK cities and towns' increasing populations.

Vegetables and fruit being recorded include potatoes, tomatoes, beans, onions, courgettes, brassicas, apples, currants, strawberries. (A full list and an explanation of what simple measurements are required are on the website.) You don't have to record everything you grow - you may just choose to submit details of one or two crops. Everything is useful.

# **Treasurer's Report 2017**

With the unfortunate death of Dave Pateman after many years as Treasurer I have stepped in to carry on. After a very steep learning curve I've managed to adapt Dave's tracking system to my preferences. Unfortunately during the change over some things have fallen through the net and so the accounts are really the best practical. This occurred simply because I did not understand the importance of certain items. One example is that I did not originally rigorously record cash difference on the till so those are actually absorbed into the Net income rather than appearing as a separate item on the accounts. I'm not too worried as the previous year these differences were only about 50p a week!

I wish we could thank Dave for all his years as treasurer but I do know that right to the end he was giving me all the assistance I asked for. I'm sure we will all miss Dave.

From the accounts you can see that trading was slightly down, mostly owing to losing one order worth about £400 of potato turnover and not selling any live plants, reducing income by about £1500. Also I suspect that the heavy discounting of old stock late in the year will have distorted revenue. The trading surplus fell, but so did our costs so the small amount of net income remained very similar to the previous year.

The committee is well aware that 2018 is the last year of the current lease so there will be changes to our cost structure going forward. You can also see that FGA has reasonable reserves to cover the contingency of moving to new premises should that be required.

Finally I'd like to point out that there was a relatively large amount for debtors in 2016 because we had not received payment for Unwins seeds due when we stopped stocking them. We used that payment to offset part of the cost of the compost delivery from Westland received in December 2016.
