When The Seed Box is open for trading a committee member will remove the padlock and then secure the site on leaving. We ask everyone to be vigilant to ensure no unauthorised persons enter the site.

TRADING REPORT Summer 2019

Yet another year of great promise seems to have become a rather dry period. I do wonder at times if Flitwick exists in a rain hollow. In the last week I've been to Sandy and driven through a mini-monsoon and flash floods, but rain in Flitwick was approximately zero. I've played golf near Bedford twice with 20 minute showers each time. For the second year running my lawn is struggling to show any green, not really having recovered from the 2018 drought.

On both my allotments and home garden I cover most items to keep the birds off. Based on our sales of nets and other items for protection, I suspect I'm not alone with birds eating anything they can, to get moisture. Winter brassicas seem to be particularly at risk, but we still have netting etc. for sale if you need any.

Earlier this year we had Metaldehyde based slug pellets on special offer as they were to be banned. Eventually a court challenge to the ban was successful so I have been able to continue selling the remaining stock. I expect the relevant Government department to try again, so I will not be restocking. The only product on FGA shelves affected by the ban would have been Doff Blue mini pellets. It has been a favourite of our members, so now is the time to buy, if you want some. We do have other pellet options and barrier deterrents available for protecting your plants from slug damage. Every year I offer substantial discounts on compost if anyone wants a complete pallet. Should you be interested, please contact me.

Whilst discussing compost, I apologise for running out of your favourite compost; Clover Multipurpose and professional. As we buy a complete lorry load each December, I will not be restocking this late in the year. We have New Horizon organic multipurpose compost and a small amount of Arthur Bowers Multipurpose available, but when they are gone that's it folks until the delivery, sorry.

There seems to be a lot happening in the wholesale potato market with the owners taking over all marketing for the Sarpo range of potatoes and our prime wholesaler changing their range. As always there are new products on offer and some old favourites return and demand for varieties changes as new items become available. An excellent example of this is Picasso, which is a Son of Cara (I believe). It certainly grows, looks and tastes very similar.

The main impacts on the FGA range are -:

- Anya, Estima, Osprey, Pentland Crown and Sarpo Mira have now gone from our list for next year
- Epicure and Majestic will be ordered from an alternative supplier
- Added Casablanca; a white general purpose potato which apparently makes excellent chips!
- Added Setanta, as it appears to be good and reasonably received in our trial this year.

A sad fact of life is that wholesale prices creep up every year. We have managed to absorb price increase for several years, but it is now necessary to raise the 3kg price to £3.75, although the price for 10 tubers is unchanged. The price of shallots rises 10p, but onions remain the same at £1.00. The order form is in this magazine, or available at the counter in the Seed Box. As always, if you pre-order I will do everything I can to ensure I get what you want.

Next year we will also be trying a red shallot, following many requests from members, so do try them and let me know if you think they should be retained on our list.

The observant amongst you will have noticed the fruits of our labours as we rationalise stock. I apologise for a few 'stock outs' this year and we will try to learn from these. There is however, a need for us to continue rationalising and we have agreed a broad outline of what and how to rationalise most other areas. We have identified items that will not be re-ordered and will eventually disappear, but in every case there will still be an alternative offered.

You may have noticed that we have managed to get several new people to open and run trading sessions. It has certainly put my wife into shock if I'm suddenly around Friday evenings or Saturday afternoons. We can always use more help, so please see me or Colin to discuss how you may be able to assist us.

New Season seeds from Fothergills are expected soon along with Dobies 2020 catalogues.

Finally I have confirmation that we will have the following on sale from this weekend:

- Broad Bean - Aquadulce, weighed to order
- Green manure - Phacelia

- Green Manure -Forage Rye
- Over wintering white onion sets
- Over wintering red onion sets
- Over wintering Garlic - Germidor.

- Support our events. In particular the FGA quiz with a team of 4 (no gardening questions).
- Support our shows.

All offers of help gratefully received (of course).

I'm writing this just after the summer show. Thank you to all those who assisted on the day and made it such a success. Of course, all the organisation in the world only goes so far, so may I congratulate all those who put in as good a set of exhibits across most classes, as I can remember. Many who came to view told me how impressed they were with what they had seen. A highlight of 2019 was the quantity and excellent quality of the tomatoes. It was an experience to observe the judge making his decision.

Continuing on show matters, the date of our next show is Saturday 5th October. I encourage you to look at the classes and if you have anything at all to enter, come along between 12.30 pm and 2.00 pm with your exhibit and we will help you from there.

One item I have inherited, is assisting with the Flitton and Greenfield Potato race. For several years our previous Chairman, Syd Pye co-ordinated this and the FGA provided seed potatoes for distribution to local childrens' organisations, including schools, to see who can grow the greatest weight in a pot provided. Roland Taylor and I have then attended on the day, to turn the potatoes out of the pots, riddle off the compost and weigh the potatoes. The worst part of the day is that we always seem to be next to the barbeque!

Finally, I have no news regarding the possible move of the Seed Box, but I just hope we have reasonable warning.
