Chit Chat from the Chair

I'm writing this 'Chit Chat from the Chair' with a great sense of bemusement at being the new Chairman of the FGA. As anyone who has seen my allotment at Station Road will know, I'm not particularly green-fingered and the most successful plants on my plot are self-sown! At this time of year, my plot (rather than me) puts on a great display of foxgloves, poppies and comfrey (I think) to the great delight of the bees. You may have heard about the worrying decline in insect numbers, if not aphids, sometimes referred to as the 'insectageddon' and have noticed the reduced numbers, compared to a decade ago, of insects splattered on your windscreen or car number plate after long journeys. As gardeners we are dependent on insects to pollinate many of our crops and to help naturally control pests, so please do consider how you can make your own plots more insect friendly. As well as vegetable seeds, we sell (at discount prices) a range of flower seeds at the Seedbox that will encourage pollinators – if in doubt, ask one of the helpers.

I hope that you all value what the FGA provides for you—great value gardening products, friendly advice, Shows, quizzes, outings etc. But all of this is 100% dependent on a (very small) group of volunteers. — as you will see, many of us on the committee have to have multiple roles to keep the FGA running Please do consider how you might be able to help, even if only for the occasional hour.

We will be putting on and offer for the smaller clover peat free multi-purpose but you will need to come in to see what it is but it will make it cheaper to purchase and make our price more competitive.

2024 FGA AGM report

Disappointingly only 11 members (including Committee members) turned up for the AGM with a further 3 members sending their apologies for not being able to attend.

J-P Carter, acting chairman, thanked everyone for coming and said it was such a shock to hear of Jim Godden's sudden death that found him back in the chairman's seat again. He then said that Jim's contributions to the Association should not be underestimated, and we should some way of honouring this – perhaps a trophy for one of the shows.

The membership report shows that we currently have 240 members, slightly down on the same period last year, with 71 of the 2023 members who have yet to renew for 2024. We did have 30 new members join during the year.

Ian Holman had put himself forward to be chairman of the Association and his appointment was accepted by all those present.

A discussion then took place about the need for more members being needed to join the Association committees and helping with the running of the Seed box. To ensure the Seed box can continue to operate we really need people to come forward and help not only on a Saturday afternoon but also supporting Dan with the trading tasks — such as looking after stock areas to ensure that stock is on the shelves and making sure Dan knows when items need re-ordering.

As you will have seen elsewhere in this magazine the seed box is staying where we are and our relationship with Farrans, the construction people, remains excellent. A member raised the question as to whether we could approach them in helping with materials for the outside of the building and the fencing and gates for the compound, all of which needs work doing to improve their appearance and usability. This suggestion will be progressed by the executive committee.

Whether you are a new or longstanding member of the FGA, have you ever thought about entering your vegetables, flowers, home produce, handicrafts or photographs at one of our Shows? If so, the Annual Show on Saturday 17th August is a great opportunity to give it a go!

The Annual Show Schedule, which should be arriving together with this magazine, lists the many vegetable, fruit, flower, home produce / cooking, arts and crafts, homemade wine, photographic and children's classes. So there's a class (or classes) for everyone.

For the vegetable, fruit, flower classes, check the schedule on the day to find out how many items you need to bring along for your chosen class(es) – generally, the more similar they are to each other, the better. When you arrive for 'Staging', between 09:00-11:45, there will be plenty of FGA helpers and your fellow exhibitors on hand to answer any questions you have – and there's no such thing as a daft question. You can also look at the FGA guide to showing which is available on the website at http://www.flitwickgardeners.co.uk/shows.htm for lots of hints and tips.

You can enter any classes but, if you've never exhibited at one of our shows before (or have never won a first prize in the main flower and vegetable sections), then you might like to start in the Novice vegetable or flower classes. As an introduction to exhibiting, they're ideal- you have a good chance of not only getting a rosette, but, depending on the standard of entry, maybe winning the Novice trophy, which you hold for a year.

Did you know, Flitwick Village Hall is over 50 years old? It was built using funds raised from the local community in the 1960s and has been well loved



and incredibly well used ever since! It is absolutely the heart of our local community.

The village hall committee needs to raise a whopping £20,000 in order to mend the leaky roof. I wanted to do my bit towards this, and a sponsored walk was a great way to help out.

Juliette and I managed to complete the hike. We walked 44 miles in total, got very tired legs, stung by nettles and wet feet! But I sincerely think it was worth it for every penny that we can raise that goes to help the village hall.
